IN RE: A.P.)	MOTION TO DISMISS APPEAL AND REMAND TO DISTRICT COURT	

Appellee, State of Maine, Department of Health and Human Services ("Department"), by and through its undersigned counsel, Nora Sosnoff, Assistant Attorney General, moves this Court to dismiss the appeal taken by the mother and to remand the case to the trial court for further child protection proceedings in accordance with 22 M.R.S. §§ 4001, et seq. The grounds for this motion are as follows:

- 1. The Appellant mother has taken consolidated appeals from the District Court's Judicial Review Order dated April 24, 2014 (Stanfill, J.), and Jeopardy Order dated June 6, 2014 (Stanfill, J.).
- 2. The mother has presented that the issue on appeal is whether the trial court erred "as a matter of law by granting the Department authority to consent to withhold life-sustaining treatment of a child temporarily in its custody, over the Mother's objection, in the absence of findings sufficient to terminate her parental rights." (Mother's Brief at 10.)
- 3. Mary Mayhew, Commissioner of the Maine Department of Health and Human Services, asserts in an attached affidavit dated September 9, 2014 that she "will not at any time in the future exercise any authority granted to the Department of Health and Human Service that would result in a medical directive of 'Do Not Resuscitate' for the child 'A.P.' without the consent of the child's mother, so long as the mother's parental rights have not been terminated." The Commissioner also states that her position will not change, regardless of the outcome of this appeal.

4. As long as the mother's parental rights have not been terminated, the Department consents to an ongoing stay of the provision in the April 24, 2014 order that would otherwise permit

the Department to authorize a medical directive of 'Do Not Resuscitate' for the child

without the consent of the child's mother.

5. There is no longer a justiciable controversy in this appeal because "[j]usticiability requires

that there be a real and substantial controversy, admitting of specific relief through a

judgment of conclusive character as distinguished from a judgment merely advising what

the law would be if..."). Dalton v. Dalton, 2014 ME 108, ¶10, ____ A. 3d.__ (quoting

Connors v. Int'l Harvester Credit Corp., 447 A.2d 822, 824 (Me.1982)).

6. The mother opposes the relief sought in this motion. The guardian ad litem could not be

reached prior to mailing.

WHEREFORE, the Maine Department of Health and Human Services respectfully

requests that the Law Court dismiss the mother's appeal and remand the case to the District Court

for further proceedings in accordance with 22 M.R.S. §§4001, et seq., together with such other

relief as the Court deems just and proper.
